## **PARTNER PROFILE:** CECILIA MOSQUEDA

I want to sincerely thank all of you who have rallied around the Center these last few years. Because of you, we have been able to overcome hurdles to achieve amazing accomplishments and we are moving full steam ahead for the second half of 2022.

We are excited to add the finishing touches for our first in-person fundraiser since 2019, the Inaugural Garden of Hope Gala on Sept. 15. Then on Sept. 24, we will celebrate in the sunshine with the return of Pinwheels Family Fun Day at Cole Park.

Right now, we are planning for the 2022 Coastal Bend Day of Giving on Nov. 8. Please give in any way you can. This is the one time of the year where all donations are matched and doubled. As a reminder, the cost to provide one forensic interview is \$300, and all of our therapy services are free. Also, we never charge the city, county or health department.

Last year, we brought in nearly \$53,000 and this year, we challenge our friends and partners to help us meet our \$65,000 goal. How about \$70,000?

Not only will this help us provide free services for years to come, but will also help us meet upcoming objectives like community awareness and prevention, increased focus on secondary trauma and self care for staff and partners, and increased access to mental health services for the children we serve. Remember, we are your CAC, and we truly rely on your support to carry out our life changing mission.

Mosqueda often tells

people who are unfamiliar with the CACCB about the "awesome team" of forensic interviewers whose work helps to prosecute child abuse cases and provide resources and support to children and families to aide in their healing process.

"CACCB not only provides support for these children, they provide them with a safe platform to speak out against their abuser," she said. "This allows Child Protective Services and Law Enforcement agencies to do their jobs ...without re-

# FAMILY ADVOCATE SELECTED FOR CACTX TRAINING TEAM


