DAY OF GIVING SETS NEW CACCB RECORD

A huge "thank you" goes out to the many generous individuals who contributed to the CACCB for the Coastal Bend Day of Giving held in November. As a result of the online matching event, the CACCB was awarded a check for \$42,845.01 on Dec. 6 from the Coastal Bend Community Foundation

In all, approximately \$2.6 million was raised and distributed among 50 area non-profits in the Coastal Bend. Twenty-five local funders stepped up to pledge \$900,000 in matching grants.

"This year's event set a new Day of Giving record in donations for the Center," said Executive Director Clarissa Mora. "We couldn't have achieved this without the help of the Coastal Bend Community Foundation, the matching donors and all our friends and supporters who believe in the work we do."

"The children seen at the CACCB have experienced more in their short lives than most adults ever will," said Mathis, who has worked with the CACCB since Feb. 2018. "The environment created by the CACCB during the initial interviews and the aftercare services provided give these special victims the best chance to overcome victimization and become survivors."

Mathis believes that when it comes to ensuring the care of these children, justice cannot be achieved without teamwork.

"Without the CACCB, the Driscoll Children's Hospital CARE Team, Child Protective Services, and all our local law enforcement agencies, prosecuting crimes against children wouldn't be possible," she said.


EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S CORNER

The committee advises the Texas Department of State Health Services on child risk/safety issues, the development of strategies to improve child death data collection and analysis, the development of position statements specific to child safety issues and research and develop recommendations that will make Texas safer for children.

I am motivated to assist in the advancement of statutes as they relate to child death and be part of a team that specifically assess the findings of local cases, making changes so that children are safer in Texas.
